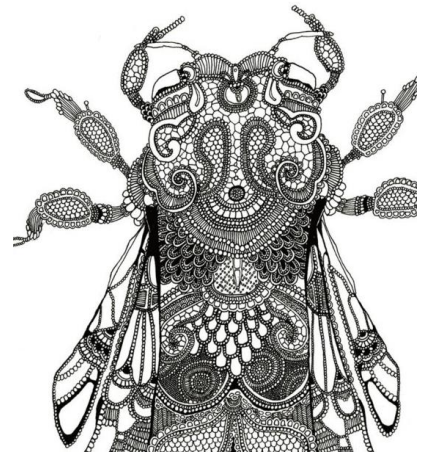

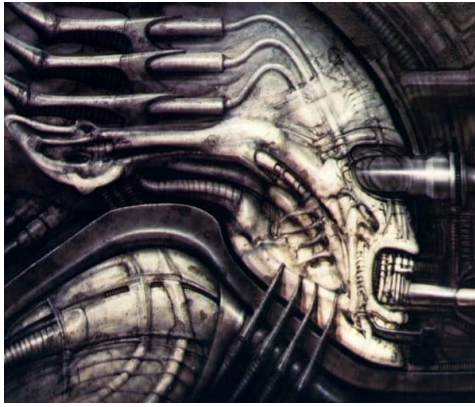
Manmade
